Location and facilities



The school is equipped with interactive whiteboards, iPads for classroom use, student computers and free wifi throughout

Location

Anglo European has an ideal location. It is 15 minutes' walk from the town centre and the beach and only 5 minutes' walk from the main train and bus stations. The residential part of the town, where most homestays are, is close by as well. The school is on a main bus route and there is a stop right outside the front gate. You can buy a weekly bus pass at the school which allows you to travel on any Bournemouth bus.



Facilities

The school is in a large, traditional English house which contains the reception, 10 classrooms, a cafeteria, a study room, a student computer room and offices and there is a patio outside. The classrooms are comfortably furnished and well-equipped with modern educational aids to allow for a truly multimedia learning experience. The rooms have either interactive whiteboards or widescreen TV monitors which connect to computers, laptops and the school's class set of 18 iPads. This brings the Internet into each room and also allows for students' work created on the iPads to be shared with others in the class.

The cafeteria, where you can buy a hot lunch and drinks and snacks throughout the day, has a massive 92" screen and projector which is used for regular film shows and sharing class projects. There is also a karaoke machine, a Wii computer games console, a pool table and vending machines. The student computer room has 15 PCs which students are free to use without charge when they like. There is also a wifi facility which enables students who have their own laptops to connect to the internet anywhere in the building. On the patio there is seating and tables for 80 people and a table tennis table. In summer time barbecues are often held on the patio.



A typical day

The school day at Anglo European is divided into four blocks: two in the afternoon and two in the morning. In the first and last blocks of the day, the lessons are guided by a coursebook. The blocks before and after the lunch break focus on improving the key skills of Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. The teachers plan these lessons based on the needs of the students in the class, according to the CEFR framework.

Students can also find additional free activities and lessons online in the Student Zone on our website. The Anglo European School Blog can also be found here and contains examples of movies, presentations, comics etc. made by our students in class.

Social and cultural programme



We believe that your language course should be complemented with an extensive social and cultural programme, which allows you to experience English culture and to meet and get to know other students.

In the summer there are frequent activities and at other times of year there are usually 3 activities per week. These include film nights, conversation club and pub nights (including karaoke)

Other events include regular International food nights, Nintendo Wii championships and summer BBQs. We also have special events to celebrate Christmas, Guy Fawkes'

night, Valentine's Day and Easter. These activities are either free or have a minimal charge.

Of course, no study programme would be complete without visits to some of our historic and cultural treasures – including London, Bath, Oxford, and Stonehenge, as well as other places closer to Bournemouth such as the Jurassic Coast World Heritage site and The New Forest National Park.

If you come as part of a group, we can organize a special excursion and activity programme according to your requirements.

Accommodation and welfare



We understand that you will only get the most out of your language course if you have somewhere welcoming and comfortable to live. Most of our students stay in English homestays, an excellent opportunity to practise English outside the classroom.

Homestay

We take great care in selecting our homestays and they are regularly inspected. Our accommodation team look for clean and well-maintained houses and they also place great importance on the friendliness of the families.

We place students in homestays according to their needs and take into account if you have special requirements.

You can choose either a single room or twin room which you share with a student of another nationality. All rooms have storage for your clothes and a place for you to study. All students who stay in homestays have breakfast and dinner with the family and they are provided with lunch at the weekends.

Some homestays are within walking distance of the school while others may be a short bus ride away. No homestay is more than a 20 minute bus ride from the school.

Residence

In the summer time we also offer accommodation in Bournemouth University residences that are located 10 minutes' walk from the school. All the residences are modern, well-equipped and comfortable and provide single-room accommodation all with ensuite bathrooms. Residential accommodation is offered on a self-catering basis. Students must be at least 18 years old in order to choose this option.

Shared apartments

Some students choose to organise their own accommodation by renting an apartment or a room in an apartment. We can give advice on how this may be done.

Hotels and guest houses

We can arrange for students to stay in hotels or guest houses.

Welfare

We want you to feel comfortable and at home during your stay with us, so among our staff are people qualified to help with academic, social or personal problems. They are available for private consultation every day.

We have a 24-hour emergency telephone number, so there will always be someone close at hand.





Your next step

Starting dates

You may start a General English course on any Monday except for the two-week Christmas and New Year period, when the school is closed. When a Monday is a public holiday, courses start on the following Tuesday.

How to Enrol

Complete the enclosed form and return it to your agent or to Anglo European School of English with the £80 enrolment fee. We will then send your confirmation documents and your invoice. The total payment of your fees must be made 14 days before your course start date.

If you need a visa to enter the UK, you must pay all your fees before we can send your confirmation documents and visa letter. If your visa is refused we will refund all fees except the enrolment fee, when you send us the refusal of entry clearance form issued by your British Embassy or Consulate. You may also enrol through our website: www.anglo-european.org

Health Insurance

If your country does not have a reciprocal health agreement with the UK you are strongly advised to take out health insurance in your own country. Alternatively, we can supply details of a British insurance scheme.

Group programmes



We are experts in organising programmes for groups travelling together

We have considerable experience of arranging programmes for groups of students travelling together. These programmes can be customised to meet the particular needs of the group and can be organised at any time of year. Group programmes can last for 1, 2, 3 or 4 weeks and may include the language course, accommodation, airport transfers, excursions and activities.

We offer free places for group leaders on the basis of one place for a leader for each 15 students.

The minimum age for participants in group programmes is 14.

The language course

The English Language course is a central part of the programme. It is designed to meet the particular needs of the students and is taught by our team of qualified and experienced teachers. We use the latest teaching materials included in the cost of the course. Students have the opportunity to benefit from modern teaching aids including interactive whiteboards and iPads.

Accommodation

Students are accommodated with carefully selected homestays. Students can be placed in twin or single rooms depending on the requirements of the group.

Meal plan

Breakfast and dinner from Monday to Friday are provided in the homestay and breakfast, lunch and dinner on Saturdays and Sundays. On days when there is an excursion, packed lunches are provided.



From Monday to Friday hot lunches are served in the school cafeteria.

Excursions

Full day excursions are organised to destinations such as London, Oxford, Bath and Brighton.

Half-day excursions are organised to destinations such as Salisbury and Stonehenge, Winchester, Portsmouth, Swanage and The New Forest. All excursions are accompanied by a member of our staff.

Social and cultural activity programme

The activity programme takes place in the afternoons and evenings. Activities in the school include: Film nights, quiz nights, international food evenings, karaoke, games evenings and barbecues. Activities in the town include: Sports, laser quest, discos, ice skating, bowling, boat trips and visits to local museums and the Oceanarium.

Costs

The costs of group programmes vary depending on a number of factors including duration, type of language programme, high or low season, group size, accommodation type, the number of excursions and activities and the arrival and departure airport.

Anglo European Juniors



Our junior summer courses offer young learners aged 8-18 the opportunity to improve their English language skills whilst enjoying a varied and exciting activity programme. The minimum period of study is two weeks and the maximum is nine weeks.

The programme includes 20 lessons per week in international classes of up to 15 students. There are six levels of study available from Beginner to Advanced, and all students are carefully tested on the first day to ensure they are placed in the right class for their level. At the end of the course all students receive a certificate as a record of their English language studies.

The activity programme includes two full-day excursions per week plus an additional half day excursion on Sundays for non-departing students. There is also a full programme of activities every afternoon and evening.


